Read all sorts of different books and make it enjoyable. Read to your child as well as asking them to read to you.

Birch class are learning about other countries from around the world. They have already done some super work learning about France, Italy, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Australia and China.

At home your child could:

Find out about another country they are interested in. Make a poster or fact sheet with things that make that country unique.	Find a picture of something from another country and write a caption or few sentences about it.	Choose a flag from another country and make it using craft materials or collaging.
Using counters, beads or buttons, learn to double and halve the amount.	Write My Daily News about what you have been doing.	Read some traditional tales from other countries, such as India, Japan or African countries. Talk about the messages for us in the stories.

Paint a picture of some animals from another country. You could paint several to make you own art zoo.	Use an atlas, globe or google maps to find some of the countries we have learnt about. Practise finding them quickly by looking at their shapes.	Do some bird watching. Find out if any of the birds you can see from your window come from other countries.
Write about a country that you have been to, or one that you would like to visit.	Ask your family about countries that they have been. Make a chart of the different countries your family have visited.	Draw a map of England – put some of the places you have been or want to go on.
